

OBTAINING YOUR CHILD SUPPORT PAYMENTS

Does your ex not pay your child's child support or only part of it? Are they always late? Solutions to get them to pay.

What are the conditions of a forced payment?

In order to make your ex pay the child support for your child(ren), you need:

- it to have been defined in a document that makes it mandatory (see definition on the back side).
- not to have been paid on the scheduled date in over a month or only have been paid in part.



1 - If you activated financial intermediation

Thanks to this free service, proposed by the **agency for the collection of unpaid child support (ARIPA)**, your child support is directly paid by your ex to your Family Benefits Office (CAF) or Agricultural Social Insurance Office (MSA). In case of non-payment, you are not required to do anything, this service immediately initiates the collection procedure for you.

Single-parent families

If you are raising your child alone, you will receive the Family Support Allowance (ASF) at the very least, an advance of around €116 per month and per child (even if your child support is lower), which will give you the time you need for your child support to be collected.

2 - If you have not activated financial intermediation, but you have a writ of execution

Initiate a procedure ahead of time: send a final notice letter (registered letter with acknowledgement of receipt) to your ex-spouse, partner or common-law partner to remind them of their obligations. If your ex does not react...

Example #1: non-payment within the past 24 months

Make a request for help collecting child support on the Child Support Public Service website. In case of non-payment, your CAF or MSA* can collect the amounts due from the past 24 months from the other parent, their employer, bank or even Unemployment Office and transfer it to you.

*if you have a writ of execution, but the CAF or MSA cannot intervene, (example: your child is over 20 years old), contact a bailiff. They can collect up to six months of unpaid child support and help you guarantee the payment of upcoming child support.

Example #2: non-payment from over 24 months ago or 6 months, if it is not collectable by your CAF or MSA

You can contact a court bailiff to initiate a request to seize their income.

3 - If you do not have a writ of execution

In case of a disagreement with your ex-spouse, civil union partner or common-law partner, contact the Family Judge (JAF), alone or with the help of an attorney, via <u>cerfa form #11530*08</u> available online. The form may be sent to the legal courts by mail or you can do so in person.

The maximum delay to claim unpaid child support is 5 years.



FORCED PAYMENT PROCEDURES FOR CHILD SUPPORT

You receive child support that has been defined in a writ of execution, i.e. a mandatory document (ruling, divorce agreement ratified by the Family Judge, notarized deed, etc.)
